Business and Labor Committee

Wednesday, March 6, 8:00am, HR E

Public Hearing

- HB 2218 Requires financial institution, when unilaterally closing account, to notify account holder of reason for closure.
- HB 2416 Requires person applying for issuance or renewal of recreational vehicle registration for small home to attest home meets certain conditions concerning mobility.
- HB 2423 Adopts Small Home Specialty Code to regulate construction of homes not more than 400 square feet in size.
- HB 2517 Prohibits state agencies from suspending or revoking license required to pursue commercial activity, trade, occupation or profession because licensee is delinquent in paying student loan debt.

Work Session

 HB 2216 Repeals sunset date on temporary law and makes permanent law requiring public universities to interview qualified minority candidate when hiring head coach.

- <u>HB 2016</u> Requires public employer to grant reasonable paid time to public employee who is designated representative to engage in certain activities.
- HB 2885 Adds extended warranties to list of collateral charges for which manufacturer may need to compensate consumer when consumer returns motor vehicle that manufacturer cannot conform to manufacturer's express warranty.
- <u>HB 2489</u> Establishes conditions of enforceability for certain employment contracts or agreements.

- HB 2089 Prohibits title loan lender and payday loan lender from making loan to consumer until seven days after consumer has fully repaid outstanding title loan or payday loan.
- <u>HB 2769</u> Permits contracting agency, in conducting procurement for architectural, engineering, photogrammetric mapping, transportation planning and land surveying services, to consider pricing policies, proposals and other pricing information as part of screening and selection of consultants in specified circumstances.
- HB 2211 Directs Department of Human Services to study issues and identify

barriers relating to employment of persons with disabilities and report results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services on or before February 1, 2021.

 HB 2212 Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for purposes of providing financial assistance to state agencies that provide workplace accommodations for employees with disabilities.
