

## **Business and Labor Committee**

#### Monday, March 18, 8:00am, HR E

#### **Public Hearing**

- <u>HB 3023</u> Requires transportation network company that operates in this state to obtain license from Department of Transportation.
- HB 3379 Permits local government to license and regulate vehicle-for-hire services and hired drivers

#### **Work Session**

• <u>HB 2016</u> Requires public employer to grant reasonable paid time to public employee who is designated representative to engage in certain activities.

#### Wednesday March 20, 8:00am, HR E

#### **Public Hearing and Possible Work Session**

- <u>HB 2804</u> Prohibits retail pet store from selling or offering to sell dog, cat or rabbit acquired from source other than animal shelter or rescue organization.
- HB 3030 Allows professional licensing board to issue temporary authorization to spouse of member of Armed Forces of United States stationed in Oregon and who holds out-of-state authorization to provide occupational or professional service.
- <u>HB 3143</u> Revises definitions regarding activities and oral representations constituting practice of engineering, professional engineering or land surveying.
- <u>HB 3205</u> Expands Telecommunication Devices Access Program to include provision of communication facilitators.
- HB 3001 Provides that peer-to-peer car rental program shall be subject to same airport fees and state and local law, including taxes and fees, as car rental company.

#### **Work Session**

 HB 2089 CARRIED OVER FROM 3-13-2019 AGENDA: Prohibits title loan lender and payday loan lender from making loan to consumer until seven days after consumer has fully repaid outstanding title loan or payday loan.

#### Wednesday March 27, 8:am, HR E

#### **Public Hearing and Possible Work Session**

• <u>HB 2787</u> Specifies that certain taxes related to transacting wet marine and transportation insurance in this state apply to authorized insurers.

- HB 3131 Permits insurer to exclude from coverage under motor vehicle liability insurance policy person other than named insured based on certain specified criteria.
- <u>HB 3218</u> Limits time during which Appraiser Certification and Licensure Board may commence disciplinary proceedings.
- HB 3003 Permits Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to release surety bond or other security on deposit with director if self-insured employer or self-insured employer group obtains paid-up insurance policy satisfactory to director.
- HB 3193 Requires that, for employers that are contractors licensed by Construction Contractors Board, order of determination must include statement that failure to pay amounts determined to be owed to wage claimant shall result in Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries notifying board of such failure and board's suspension of contractor's license.

## **Natural Resources Committee**

#### Tuesday March 19, 8:00am, HR E

#### Public Hearing

- HB 2835 Establishes public right to recreational use of certain public use waterways.
- HB 3327 Creates Oregon Independent Science Review Board.
- <u>HB 3016</u> Appropriates moneys to State Department of Fish and Wildlife for activities related to summer steelhead hatchery production for Santiam River.

#### · Work Session

- <u>HB 2222</u> CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2-14-2019 AGENDA: Requires State Forestry Department to annually report to Legislative Assembly or interim committee regarding development, implementation and administration of Oregon Forestland-Urban Interface Fire Protection Act.
- <u>HB 2293</u> CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2-14-2019 AGENDA: Amends residency requirements for purposes of licenses, tags and permits related to wildlife.
- HB 2365 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2-14-2019 AGENDA: Appropriates moneys to State Forestry Department for 2019-2021 biennium to carry out integrated pest management program to combat Sudden Oak Death.

Thursday March 21, 8:00am, HR E

**Public Hearing** 

- <u>HB 2574</u> Requires Department of Land Conservation and Development to establish electronic information system to receive, consolidate and organize public record information concerning shellfish mariculture in Oregon.
- HB 2979 Appropriates moneys to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Association of Oregon Counties to contract for provision of technical assistance and information to landowners for complying with certain requirements related to replacement or repair of tide gates with opening size of four feet or smaller.
- <u>HB 2381</u> Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to operate program in southwest Oregon to control populations of species that prey on salmon.
- <u>HB 2553</u> Requires State Fish and Wildlife Commission to adopt certain requirements related to carcasses of returning hatchery fish.

#### **Work Session**

- <u>HB 2071</u> Modifies eligibility for hunting tags for female mountain sheep.
- HB 2361 Requires State Fish and Wildlife Commission to establish and prescribe fees for multiyear resident and nonresident hunting licenses.

# **Economic Development**

### Monday March 18, 1:00pm, HR D

#### **Public Hearing**

- <u>HB 2174</u> For urban renewal plan proposed on or after July 1, 2019, that includes public building project, requires concurrence of at least three of four taxing districts estimated to forgo most property tax revenue under proposed plan.
- HB 2181 Requires State Workforce and Talent Development Board to conduct study and analyze how to best implement recommendations developed by Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development.
- HB 2310 Establishes Prosperity 1,000 Pilot Program to provide career coaching, occupational training and job placement services for at least 1,000 low-income job seekers residing in areas of concentrated poverty.
- HB 2320 Provides that fixed percentage of certain forecasted video lottery revenues, adjusted for certain allocations to Regional Solutions Program, be transferred to counties for economic development.

#### **Work Session**

- <u>HB 2613</u> Requires Oregon Business Development Department to prepare and report master plan for county fairground capital construction.
- HB 2699 Provides that brownfield granted property tax incentive benefit under chapter 96, Oregon Laws 2016, is eligible for special assessment, exemption or

partial exemption granted under other law for which such property is eligible.

 HB 2672 Authorizes Department of Revenue to reimburse State Department of Agriculture, State Department of Energy and Water Resources Department for expenses incurred in administration and enforcement of activities related to cannabis.

#### Wednesday March 20, 1:00pm HRD

#### **Public Hearing**

- <u>HB 2243</u> Defines "public library" as public facility providing free and equal access to library and information services for all residents of local government unit.
- HB 2541 Authorizes Oregon Business Development Department to make grants to certain small cities for purposes of studying, developing and capitalizing public transit systems.
- HB 2733 Directs Oregon Tourism Commission to identify, designate and monitor tourism districts in this state.
- HB 2890 Permits Oregon Business Development Department to hire attorney for purpose of prosecuting patent for any invention that faculty, staff or students reduce to practice while employed by or enrolled in public high school in this state.
- HB 2934 Appropriates moneys to Oregon Business Development Department to make grants to nonprofit corporations for purpose of hiring staff to coordinate activities related to organization, administration and programming of innovation districts.

#### **Work Session**

- HB 2054 Makes program changes to Oregon Innovation Council statutes.
- HB 3110 Creates Oregon Rural Service Center within Oregon Business
  Development Department to assist rural counties, and cities and special districts
  located in rural areas, to apply for and manage public and private funding
  opportunities for purposes of workforce and economic development.
